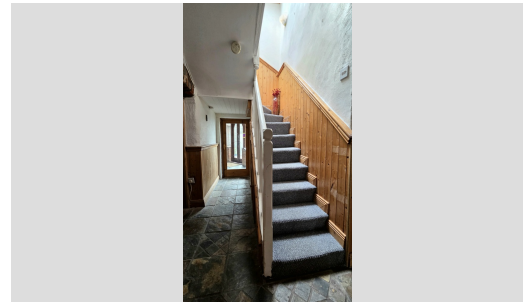
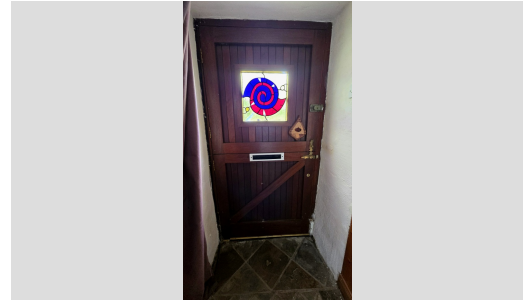

History:

A rare opportunity to own a historic Irish residence in the heart of the Lakelands, County Cavan. Set in the beautiful scenic village of Ballyhaise, with the Annalee River, fly fishing and amenity area. The agricultural college in the historical Humphreys estate house provides a pristine best practice farm area surrounding and protecting the village from over development.

This house originally built by the overseer of the Humphreys estate William McClintock, prior to the 1798 rebellion. It was first registered to the Smith family in 1912 as their farm residence. Known as the Ceile house with the first hot water stove in the village. It was a popular community house owned by "Paddy sausages".

The current owner, civil engineer, bought and renovated the property in 1997 from Paddy's daughter, Rose.

This distinctive property retains many original period features that are increasingly difficult to find. With exceptionally thick traditional walls, original fireplaces, low historic doorways, and handcrafted architectural details, the house offers a glimpse into centuries of Irish history while remaining a comfortable family home.

The property combines character and practicality, with two large bedrooms and the potential for a third or fourth, generously sized bedrooms. Historic functional fireplaces in four rooms including 2 bedrooms .Later additions, including the stainless steel kitchen, sun room and patio/ garden, reflect the evolution of the home over generations.

This traditional construction home is complimented by modern insulation materials, gas central heating, double glaze windows etc. make for a unique cosy home.

A historic house with, traditional half doors, shuttered windows, wainscoting, reclaimed pitch pine flooring, brickwork, slate roofing, make this a particularly special property for buyers seeking more than a modern house.

Rich in atmosphere and heritage, the home showcases features associated with historic Irish craftsmanship, including deep-set walls, traditional finishes, and architectural details rarely found in contemporary buildings. Every room tells part of the story of the property's long history.
